The history of thoroughbred breeding in the Hunter Valley dates back to the very early days of settlement - from the first breeding land surveyed and the first settler and stud established by George Bowman in the early 1820's and the importation of the Thoroughbred Stallion 'Crawford' to Potter Macqueen's Segenhoe Stud in 1824. For some 200 years the Hunter's Thoroughbred Breeding industry has developed into Australia's premier thoroughbred breeding region. The extensive honor roll of elite horses and people, a list too long and ever increasing, continues supremacy in Australia's Thoroughbred Breeding Industry today. It now stands as one of three global Centres of Thoroughbred Breeding Excellence, alongside Kentucky in the USA and Newmarket in the UK.

From the formation of the Upper Hunter Thoroughbred Breeders Society in 1951 (which led to the formation of the Bloodhorse Breeders Association of Australia (NSW Division)) to today - the Hunter Thoroughbred Breeders Association (HTBA) has a long history of breeding thoroughbred champions and championing thoroughbred breeders.

The HTBA, through its diligence and dedication to our cause is a recognised and respected advocate for the Hunter Valley Thoroughbred Industry.
