

2024 HTBA PRESIDENT'S AWARD FOR LIFETIME ACHIEVEMENT DR CATHERINE CHICKEN BVSc (Hons) PhD MANZCVS Dip VCS

15 May 2024

This year's winner of the 2024 HTBA President's Award for Lifetime Achievement has devoted her life to the pursuit of excellence from tending to the care of high-performance equine athletes, furthering research and understanding of equine pathology and microbiology, fighting to protect our industry and a sustainable future, forging connections with researchers and innovators, mentoring future generations, and giving back to her profession and community. She has a formidable intellect with an unstoppable drive yet is unassuming and shies from the limelight. This year's HTBA President's Award is presented to the much respected, multitalented, multi-award winner, Dr Catherine Chicken.

Born and bred in New Zealand, her love of country life and horses started from a young age as did her ambition to become a vet. Raised in Australia, she graduated from the University of Sydney with a Bachelor of Veterinary Science (Honours). Following her graduation, and with a few years' experience in mixed practice in rural NSW under her belt, she set forth to Newmarket UK, to ply her trade.

On her return from Newmarket, as a sister Centre of Thoroughbred Breeding Excellence, Scone and its community became the ultimate beneficiaries of her talents and devotion.

In the early1990's, a ground-breaking time for both the Scone Veterinary Hospital and its professionally qualified staff, this bright, young, and talented veterinarian took charge of the Scone Equine Hospital's Clovelly Intensive Care Unit. The first of its kind, caring for foals and an increasing number of sick horses. Through her dedication and care Catherine led the unit and with her team provided invaluable care for sick foals and adult horses. Now the Intensive Care Unit at Clovelly Stables is world renowned for the 24 hour care it provides for ill neonates, adults and post-operative patients.

With a growing practice and two small children, Catherine turned her mind to her attention, energy and intellect to her next labour of love. A Doctorate at the University of Melbourne, on bacterial infection - *Rhondococcus equi*, commonly known as "rattles", causing bacterial pneumonia in foals and young horses. An undertaking not for the fainthearted and one in which she excelled forging invaluable connections between professionals on the equine frontline and in research to come together, and through research and innovation, get things done.

Catherine applied her considerable talents to serve on the Australian Equine Veterinary Association in many capacities, including State representative, Member of the Equine Education sub-committee, and as Editor of the Australian Equine Veterinarian (1997-2020). The Australian Veterinary Association recognised her many achievements by awarding her the Meritorious Service Award in 2020 and the Lifetime Service to the Horse Industry in 2022.

Catherine has an indefatigable ability to apply her scientific credentials, energy and drive in pursuit of excellence and a sustainable future. She represented the HTBA on the Upper Hunter



Air Quality Monitoring network for over a decade, (is/was) a member of the Upper Hunter Shire Sustainability Committee, and represented Thoroughbred Breeders Australia on the Agrifutures Australia Thoroughbred Horse Research Program Board. She was elected chair of this Panel in 2022 – a position she holds today.

Catherine's ability to give back knows no bounds. If she is not working away to further the interests of the thoroughbred community, she is working to further the interests of her own community here in Scone. She is a respected mentor of young vet graduates, through the Australian Veterinary Association Graduate Mentoring Program. She is a keen contributor to the Upper Hunter Where There's a Will Wellbeing Superspreaders initiative and a committed member of the Scone Literary Festival. She is a firm believer that "you get a lot more from giving than from taking".

To a self proclaimed life long learner, a fierce intellect with an even more fierce drive, an equine and community dynamo, a respected mentor, a dedicated and indefatigable community advocate, a loving wife and proud mother of two, the HTBA is very proud to award Catherine Chicken the 2024 President's Award for Lifetime Achievement.

2023 HTBA MURRAY BAIN AWARD FOR SERVICE TO INDUSTRY AWARD RECIPIENT – MR TONY SCOTT

The Murray Bain Service to Industry Award honours the outstanding achievements of those in our industry who champion exceptional service to industry with hands-on practice and not at a safe distance.

This year's Murray Bain Award winner is the personification of this award. He is a genuine horseman, who throughout his career has worked up close and personal with our equine athletes, a racing enthusiast, a man of international experience, outstanding horsemanship, an exceptional breeding operator and a highly respected mentor and colleague, Mr Tony Scott.

Born, bred and education in England, Tony followed his passion for racing as soon as he left school in 1978. For nearly 50 years, he has followed his passion for horses working in racing stables in France, stallion farms in Kentucky and here in the Hunter Valley, Australia's Centre of Thoroughbred Breeding excellence.

His first job in Australia at the end of the 1980's was for Sir Tristan Antico at Barramul Stud in the Widden Valley. Tony went on to work for William Inglis and Sons in Sydney then as Broodmare Manager and later Stud Manager for the historic Segenhoe Stud (now Vinery) - witnessing and contributing first hand to the evolution of the Segenhoe Stud into Vinery under the leadership of Tony Bott, George Hoffmeister, Tommy Simon and Peter Orton. During this time he worked with admired stallions such as Red Ransom and More Than Ready and successful racehorses such as Exceed and Excel, Bell Du Jour, Typhoon Tracy and Russian Revolution.

Following a nearly two decade stellar career at Viney, Tony was recruited by Aquis to manage their new stud operations in the Hunter during a time of enormous expansion. Tony has remained at the farm following Emirate Park's resumption of its operations, managing and preparing weanlings and yearlings, including Manaal a star of this current racing season.

Tony is renowned for his exceptional horsemanship, team management capabilities and his unfailing calmness under pressure. He is highly respected throughout the industry for his wisdom and experience, his mentoring and his friendship.
